CAUTHE 2010 Conference

CAUTHE 2010, the 20th annual conference of the Council for Australian Tourism and Hospitality Education was held in Tasmania from 8 to 11 February. Hosted by the School of Management at the University of Tasmania, the very successful conference attracted 250 delegates from all States and Territories of Australia as well as more than 60 delegates from 13 other countries.

More than 170 papers were presented at the conference where speakers were challenged to respond to the conference theme, *Tourism and Hospitality - Challenge the Limits*.

Presentations covered a variety of areas including: heritage tourism, ethical and sustainable tourism, place and destination management, consumer demand for tourism and hospitality, tourism and hospitality education and challenging the right to travel.

CAUTHE Bill Faulkner PhD Workshop 2010

As is customary, the Bill Faulkner PhD Workshop was held in conjunction with the CAUTHE 2010 conference this year on Monday 8 February in Hobart. Twenty-three PhD Scholars with a wide range of research interests from universities all around Australia as well as internationally, came together with tourism and hospitality academics and recent PhD graduates to participate in a full day of program activities and sessions, and to network with each other. These included 'The PhD Challenge' with Dr Hugh Kearns, small group discussions about PhD topics and issues, breakout sessions on the challenges of writing and the darker moments of the PhD journey, as well as testimonials from recent PhD graduates.

The feedback from PhD students was very enthusiastic, for example:

'It is very different than other usual workshops. Much more engaging.'

'The small group discussions were really useful. Also Hugh Kearns activity was insightful and provided the opportunity to get to know the other

students, their topics, their progress and their challenges.'

'The activity based exercises were fun and interesting. The metaphors were very suited to the topic and it was good to work with other students.'

Overall, both students and academics alike agreed that the day was fun, interactive and very useful to PhD students at any stage of the journey, with some potential connections and collaborations emerging from the day. Thanks to Brent Ritchie and the organising team and, to everyone who participated in the day and helped continue the success of the Bill Faulkner workshop.

The Bill Faulkner Workshop will of course be held again next year in Adelaide and CAUTHE is looking to expand the focus to include both PhD scholars and early career researchers in the program. Stay tuned throughout the year for further updates.
