- Sara shared her knowledge and ideas about setting up a CAUTHE college of experts. The presentation generated a lot of questions and there was good discussion after the presentation.

Time and commitment

- The meeting acknowledged that there are significant costs and time involved in implementing a peer-review process.
- Is there an 'off the-shelf' product that we can use? There are existing tools which could be used eg *Sparkplus*.

Feedback

- Feedback after the session from some participants was that the session provided them with a much better context for understanding the importance of TLOs and where they fit in to the broader HESF.

Outcome

- There is a core group of people who are committed to continue with the process.
- One suggestion for moving forward was to run a pilot peer review process with a small group of volunteers from different institutions.
- Several people have volunteered already this seems entirely feasible, particularly if the pilot adopted the EROS approach.
