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## 1. CONFERENCE OVERVIEW

# 1.1 Background and overview

The 2020 conference marked the end of a long period of growth in the hospitality and tourism sectors, with COVID-19 appearing in full force shortly after the completion of the conference. The 2020 conference was very successful, the response to the call for papers for the CAUTHE 2020 Conference was been outstanding, with 297 papers being initially submitted and 220 being presented at the conference. This is one of the largest responses to CAUTHE submissions ever and has driven strong delegate numbers to result in one of the largest CAUTHE conferences to date, with over 280 attendees. We were pleased to offer a special concurrent paper session for seven delegates, whose

travel was cancelled due to Coronavirus, to present their papers remotely. Delegate survey feedback was outstanding, and the conference managed to deliver an excellent experience without making a financial loss. AUT Events provided excellent support and catering. The best aspects of the conference were generally acknowledged as being the incorporation of indigenous culture, a warm and friendly feeling, excellent catering, well organised and well communicated sessions and efficient paper management.

# 5.2 Refereeing process

The refereeing process used the ExOrdo system and this allowed for efficient processing of the very large numbers of papers to be reviewed. On the whole the reviewed papers were returned to authors within a reasonable time frame and feedback from the delegate survey was positive about the reviewing process. Apart from the pressure of large volumes of papers – there were no major problems in this area.

Areas for improvement and future consideration: The ExOdo conference App was not used as widely and not enjoyed as much as we had hoped, perhaps more education and promotion of future apps could improve the uptake. Integrating the paper management system with CAUTHE requirements for the proceedings proved testing as ever, and consideration might be given to better co-ordination of the paper management system and proceedings in the future. In retrospect we were very lucky to be able to hold the conference before COVID-19 closed the world down.
