Background

The workshop will continue the work of 2020 Mid-year workshop series, at which participants developed a TH&E Comprehensive rubric which addresses the tourism, hospitality and events Standards, from first-year N-/Low-Fail to graduate Masters HD.

The aim of the 2021 workshop is to generate guidelines for specific assessment design as aligned with rubric, domains, and threshold learning outcomes, specifically:

- 1. Guidelines for rubrics:
 - to enable colleagues to develop unit specific rubrics from the comprehensive rubric
 - to include a high degree of 'nesting' (complementarity) with other institutional, accreditation, and other attribute requirements.
- 2. Guidelines for the design of assessment tasks. The assessment guidelines will be explicitly inclusive of:
 - encouraging innovative, diverse and hybrid assessment types
 - addressing academic integrity and online delivery
 - incorporating benchmarking, student and industry feedback opportunities.
