The SIG will also help foster mentoring of CAUTHE ECR/PhD student members with more established, senior researchers through:

- Engagement – develop links with CAUTHE member researchers as well as improve links with industry representatives and government agencies. Improve the quality and effectiveness of research activities, publications on the topic and substantially boost the submission and funding of ARC grant applications
- Relationships – facilitate cooperative research and research partnership programs related to government and industry associations
- Production – undertake multi or inter-disciplinary research (strategic and applied) across countries between researchers, agencies and industry
- Diffusion – communicate and share research findings and best practices amongst SIG members and collaborators
